White Ribbon Day 25 November 2015 - DV Takes Many Forms

White Ribbon Day is 25 November 2015. It is a day for men to stand tall and say no to violence in all their relationships.

Most of us know that physical violence has no place in our relationships. But sometimes, we don't recognise that violence takes many forms. Stalking someone, physically intimidating them, controlling their finances, constantly belittling them, ridiculing their culture or background, monitoring their movements, isolating them from their friends and family can all be forms of domestic violence.

According to Robert Pelletier, Director of Macarthur Legal Centre, "If behaviour causes someone to live in fear or to believe that they are worthless and have no control over their lives, then it has probably crossed the line into a form of violence. It may be against the law even if there is no physical abuse."
