MACARTHUR region domestic violence advocate Tanya Whitehouse said she was humbled just to be nominated for the Law and Justice Foundation of NSW Justice Medal.

At the glittering awards night at Parliament House on October 15, it took her a while to realise the winner they were talking about was actually herself.

"The chick from Campbelltown won! Who would figure?" Ms Whitehouse said in response.

Every year the Law and Justice Foundation presents awards to community groups and individuals who make an outstanding contri-



bution to the service of the community.

The main award, the Justice Medal, goes to the person who, in the opinion of the judges, has made an exceptional contribution to helping the disadvantaged access justice.

"It was good enough just to be nominated," she said. "I almost died when I realised they were talking about me on the night.
